MAX4Kids 2023 Scholarship Recipients

In 2023, nine deserving high school seniors were recognized by the MAX4Kids Foundation, all representing the counties in which we serve. To receive this honor, students had to submit activities, leadership commitments, high school transcripts, and an essay describing their unique goals. These students, selected by an independent panel of judges, were each awarded a \$5,000 MAX4Kids scholarship to further their education and pursue their career goals. In total, \$45,000 was awarded in scholarship dollars for 2023.








COMMUNITY MATTERS
